<p>Sports Med PGY-1 non-surgical Sports Medicine Rotation</p> <p>The residents do not go to Orthopaedic Associates of Michigan (OAM) for a rotation, they go with the OAM doctors just for a few days a month for "office visits". The rest of the time they are with the OAM doctors at university of Michigan Health-West for surgeries, fracture conference, inpatient rounds, consults, etc.</p>

Vacation Policy:

Vacation requests will be considered for a rotation as long as request is given at least 30 days in advance and resident duties are covered by other residents in the program. Residents have a maximum of 20 days of paid time off which can be taken throughout the year, although the number of approved days per rotation are limited to ensure an adequate educational experience.

Additional Information (optional):

The basic surgical skills curriculum is provided each morning for the first month of residency. The first two weeks, together PGY-1's review the core principles of orthopaedic surgery. Topics include reading radiographs and advanced imaging, basics of fracture management, and skill workshops on power tools, suturing, knot tying, splinting, and casting. Throughout the remainder of the first month, the curriculum progresses to more advanced topics such as principles of internal fixation, plates and screws, surgical approaches, pediatric fractures, and introduction to arthroscopy. PGY-1's throughout the year work extensively with cadavers on surgical approaches such as intramedullary nails, plates and screws, and arthroplasty. This is taught by Program Director Thomas Matelic, MD. Didactic sessions are arranged by the orthopaedic surgery department.
