### The Emergency Medicine Residency

- 6 residents per year
- Residents progress with graduated responsibility through both emergency department settings
- 8 months per year spent in the Emergency Department, the remainder of time spent in scheduled or chosen electives
- 100% supervision and feedback on all resident cases
- Diversity in attending styles provides a variety of input and opinion on case management
- Strong academic schedule; required weekly didactics, emphasis the CORE content of the Emergency Department
- Residents provide lectures both within the Residency and hospital wide
- Ongoing written board-style quizzes; oral boards case reviews. Follows Foundations of EM Curriculum.

### The Emergency Department

- Annual census at Metro Health University of Michigan Health is 65,000
- Level II Trauma Certification and Certified Stroke Center
- 28 Monitored Beds, 31 Total Emergency Department beds
- Residents, interns, and students from a variety of programs regularly rotate through the department
- High acuity and residents to patient ratio provide ample opportunity to learn critical care management as well as perform numerous procedures
- ACLS trained and supportive nursing staff
- Provides medical staff and coverage for sporting events in Grand Rapids including; Grand Rapids Triathlon, and The Grand Rapids Marathon
